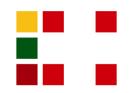

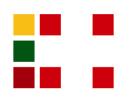

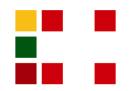

	Final financial audit of the Programme conducted in April-May 2017, no major deficiencies were detected.
	Energy audit activities implemented in December 2016 – April 2017.
	Survey of patient satisfaction with in-patient services (final evaluation of satisfaction) conducted in 4thQ/2016 – 1stQ/2017. Improvement of conditions for patients and increased satisfaction about the comfort in rooms was noted in all 24 hospitals which participated in energy efficiency Programme.

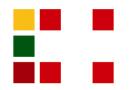






### Reporting on the Energy Efficiency in Hospitals Programme (2)

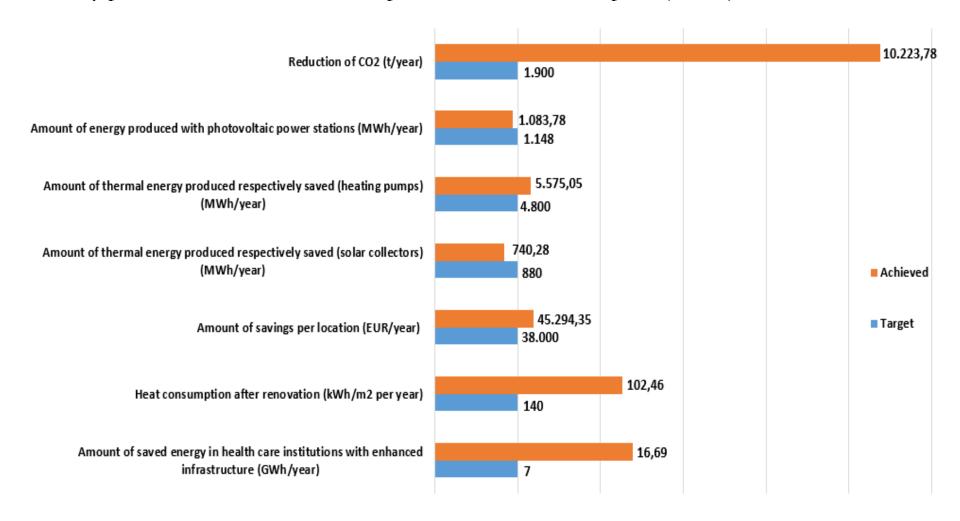
Expected results of the Programme: buildings of hospitals and energy efficient engineering systems renovated/installed, premises of units for perinatal and neonatal care services renovated
Main conclusions of energy audit:
energy efficiency measures introduced in hospitals were appropriate and most adequate to needs of each institution (in terms of energy saving and modernization of buildings)
measures installed in hospitals will not only save expenditures (in relation to heating and electricity) but also ensure general reliability and service time of engineering systems
modernization of electricity supply systems also ensures compliance with regulations on the use of medical equipment and hygiene standards of hospitals
increase of potential for effective use of energy still exists at hospitals – heating pumps could be connected not only to hot water supply system but also to heating system

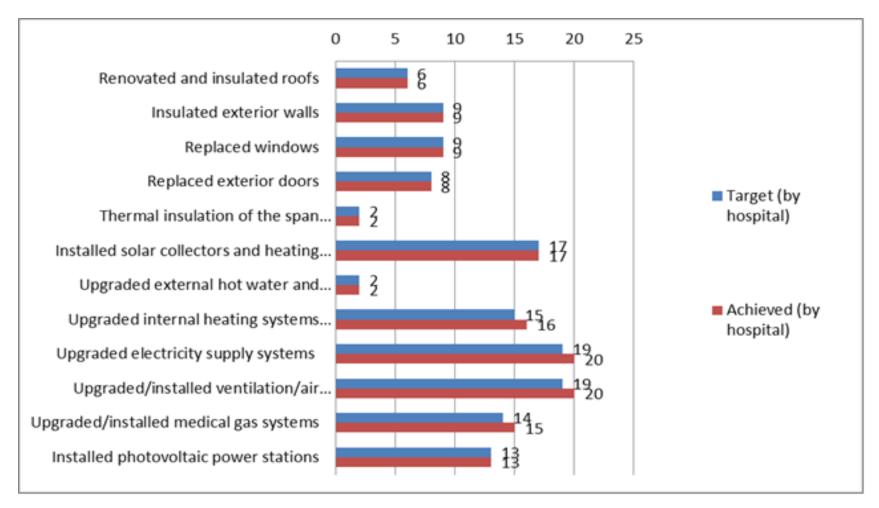


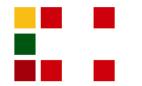

- Final financial audit of the Programme conducted in April-May 2017, no major deficiencies were detected.
- Survey of patient satisfaction with in-patient services (final evaluation of satisfaction) conducted in 4thQ/2016 - 1stQ/2017. General patient satisfaction with obstetric services increased from 14% (2007) to 51% (2016). Training seminars had a positive influence on professional development of medical personnel.

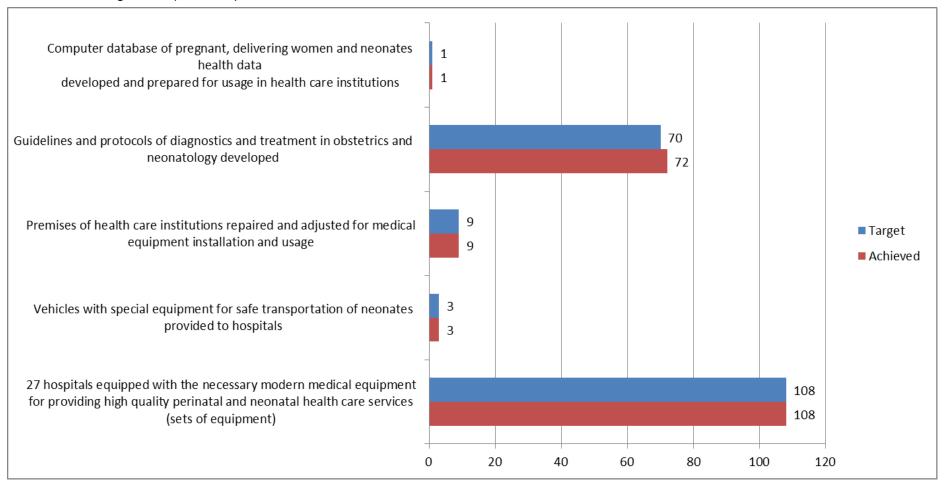

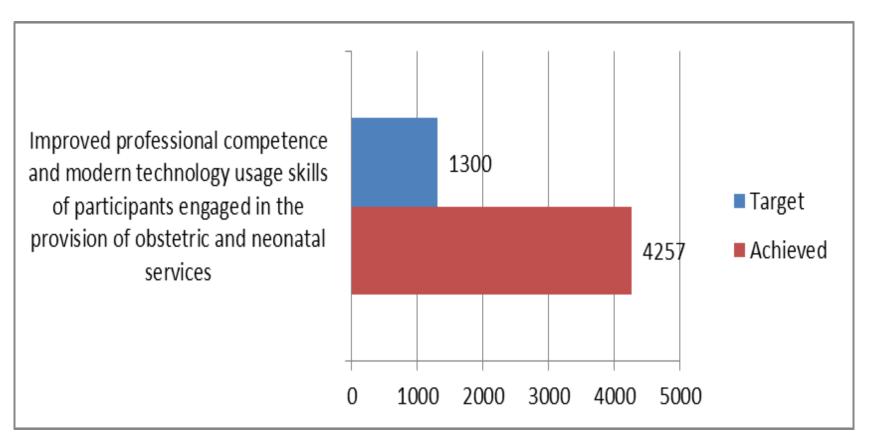


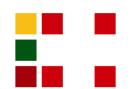

• Overall innovation performance of Lithuania has been improving since <u>2008</u>, with a small decline in 2015. According *European Innovation Scoreboard 2016 country ranking* Lithuania is a Moderate Innovator. In fact sheet "Innovation performance compared: How innovative is your country?" the European Commission noted that over an eight-year period (2008-2015), 21 Member States have increased their innovation performances. Lithuania is among the fastest growing innovators (with average annual growth rates in innovation performance of 2% or more).

<u>Outcomes level:</u> to support Lithuanian-Swiss research cooperation and to enhance the knowledge base in selected R&D topics via joint research projects and institutional partnerships

• Collaboration of the Lithuanian and Swiss institutions in the framework of 11 joint research projects in the area of R&D with special focus on mutually defined R&D themes: natural sciences, environmental sciences and technology and health/life sciences, have been established.

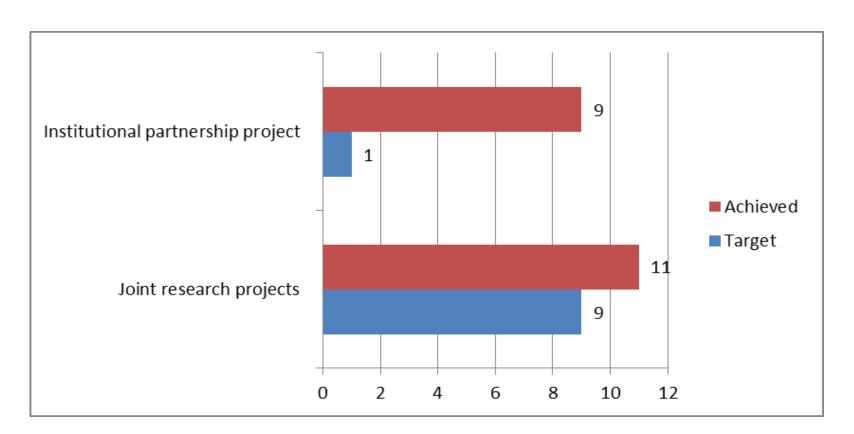

	Input of Programme for development of partnerships is to be treated as significant (prior to start of Programme, Lithuanian – Swiss cooperation in research field was based on more individual than institutional level).
	Input of Programme for integration of Lithuanian research sector into the international research area is to be treated as significant (strengthening of human resources, scientific development in concrete research fields, improvement of research results, etc.).
	both, beneficiary institutions in Lithuania and their Swiss partners, evaluated partnerships as the ones that met expectations to high or very high level (productivity, value added, effectiveness)
	future perspectives for cooperation are evaluated as high by Lithuanian researchers and higher than average by Swiss researchers

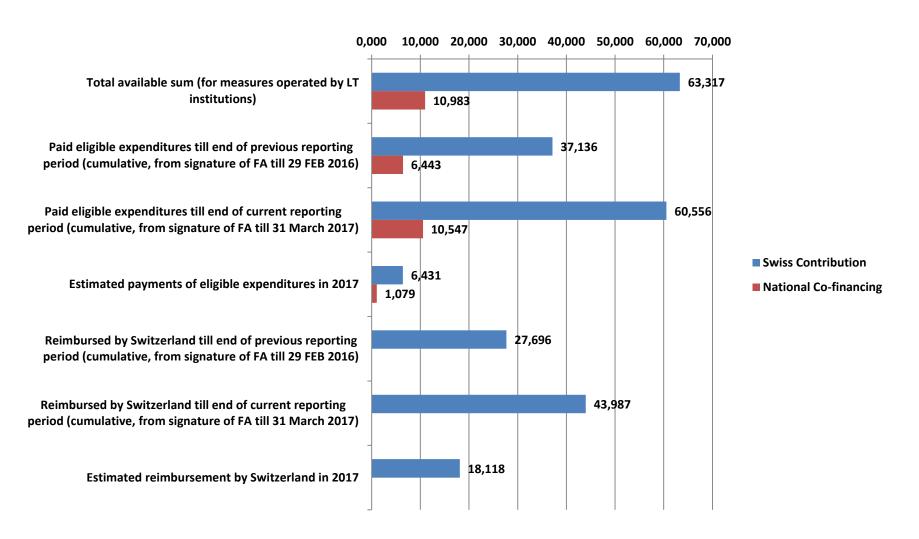

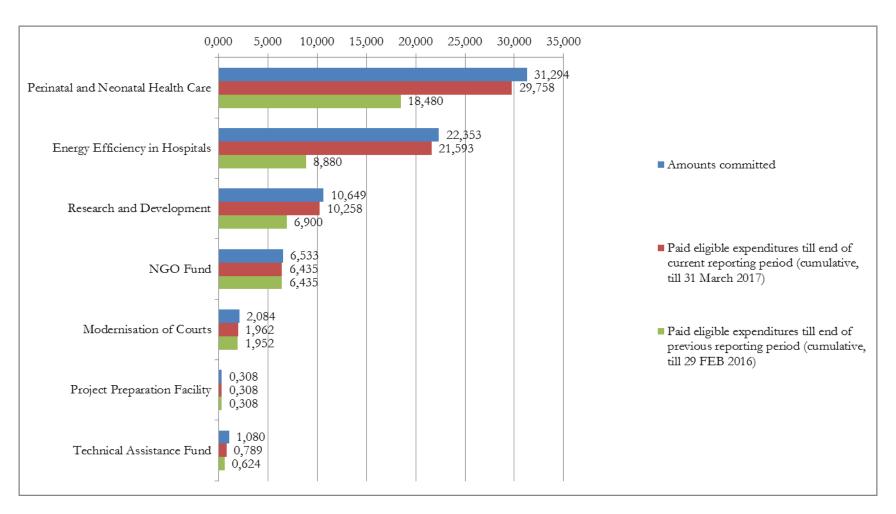
### Disbursements, mln. CHF







### Disbursements by Programmes (Contribution + National Cofinancing, mln. CHF)



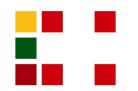

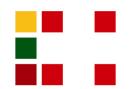

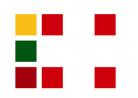
- Publicity activities performed under the programme "Research and Development":
